Discoverers & explorers of the wild

A collage-making activity is a fun way for children to learn any concept. When the collage is of wild animals, it enhances **finger** and hand strength through the use of craft and glueing movements and spans many subjects from biology to geography and habitats. Children also develop creativity and artistic skills as they express themselves through unique designs and ideas. Relating the zebra and giraffe to savannah lands, learning how the tiger, the leopard, lion, cheetah, panther are different, creating a safari of their imagination, they returned as happy explorers.

Every child of Happy Hours learns to manage themselves independently. A special Montessori activity based on buttoning & unbuttoning was conducted to develop eye-hand coordination and fine motor skills of our little ones. Children waited patiently for their turn and were delighted to find that, without any help they could button each garment.

Students of Grade II Curious Crew conducted a role-play on their Hindi lesson Hare rang ka ghoda, using storytelling techniques and role enactment to learn important life lessons. The storytelling technique is a familiar practice at our school, and children participate actively and engage with peers to learn unforgettable lessons through these age-old techniques.

To provide a visual representation of learning and physically see what they have learned, students were asked to prepare books on the subject of **collective nouns**. The literary activity was the perfect context for them to learn all about different collective nouns and rules on how they are used. It also provided a memory hook to the topic.

Acting as characters in a story can lead to a better understanding of the story's themes and messages, as one understands it through the motivations and experiences of the characters. As they went back to America of the 19th century, their comprehension and engagement with the story were enhanced through an inside-out view of the characters in the story.

Role of parents in K-12 education

Strong partnership between parents and schools is a theme on which our Mentor, Dr. Sangeeta Bhatia, is known to be an expert. At a recent panel discussion for educators, she spoke of the risks of over-parenting and how important it is to find the right balance when bringing up children. She shared that children are just like seeds - they need air, water and sunlight but in the right proportions if they are to grow and thrive.

"The biggest problem we face as school leaders is that parents don't play any more with children. They don't go to parks in the evening, they don't play with toys. Gaming has moved to gaming on mobile phones, tablets, digital gaming... where no digital platform can take a school's place is No. 1 in core values. And second is to be able to innovate and arouse curiosity in a child."

North India School Educators Summit & Merit Awards: Accolades for KIIT World School


